DEAD SERIOUS. AGE MATTERS! ABOUT THE AGE GUIDELINES

*Heads up, ghostly ghouls and future Netherworld legends! Due to the mature themes and humor in Beetlejuice, Jr., only performers ages 12-18 (at time of audition) are guaranteed a spot in the cast. Performers who are 10 or 11 MAY audition, but are not guaranteed a spot in the cast. Casting will be based on skill level, size, maturity, and ultimately at the directors' discretion. We want to ensure that our cast is ready to handle the show's spooky fun, hilarious chaos, and heartfelt moments with the energy and maturity they deserve. So, if you're within this age range and ready to bring the strange and unusual to life, this is your moment! If not, don't worry! Your spotlight moment is coming when Madagascar, Jr. hits our stage next spring!

Our Policy for Actors Rehearsing Multiple Shows

LET'S TALK COMMITMENT & COMMUNITY

At Wild Horse Children's Theater, we *love* watching our actors grow—not just on our stage, but across the whole theater community. Working with different directors, choreographers, and musical directors is a fantastic way to gain experience, stretch your skills, and make lifelong friends.

Theater should always be joyful, and no one should ever tell you not to work with another company. We're proud to be part of a local theater scene that lifts each other up and supports one another, because when one stage shines—we all do! BUT... (cue dramatic lighting)

Beetlejuice, Jr. is a whole different beast—wild, wacky, and wonderfully intense! It's a high-energy show that needs every actor fully committed, focused, and ready to give it their all.

While we normally do our best to accommodate actors involved in multiple productions, this time around, we need you all in. ✓ That means being present at every rehearsal you're called for ✓ And mandatory attendance for BOTH tech weeks

So before you audition, take a good, honest look at your calendar. School? Sports? Other shows? Big life events? Make sure you can give this production the time, energy, and presence it deserves.

We're building something big, bold, and Broadway-worthy—and we want you to be at your absolute best, not stressed out and stretched too thin. So check that schedule, clear some space, bring your A-game, and get ready to make some Beetlejuice-sized theater magic in what will definitely be THE show to be a part of in 2025!!!



#1 Rule: HAVE FUN! This is your time to shine—so enjoy every second of it!

AUDITION DAY: STEP-BY-STEP

- 1. Auditions are held in one-hour blocks with up to 25 performers per slot.
- 2. When you arrive, head through the main entrance of the Performance Hall to check in and receive your nametag and audition number.
- 3. Once checked in, auditioners will be seated in the theater.
- 4. One by one, each performer will take the stage to sing their audition piece.
- 5. After everyone has sung, we'll teach a short dance combo—then you'll perform it in small groups.
- 6. When it's all done, you'll exit through the side door for parent pickup.

INFO FOR PARENTS

- Got siblings auditioning? Schedule them in the same time slot so it's easy for everyone.
- Please arrive 15 minutes early and make sure your audition form is completed online before you get there.
- Parents can accompany their child at check-in, and stay to watch auditions IF your performer wants
 you there. (Some kids like the support, others prefer to fly solo—respect their vibe!)
- Callback slips will be handed out after each group finishes. NO CALLBACK doesn't mean NO PART!
 Our casting team is super skilled and we often cast roles during the initial audition!

🍀 AUDITION TIPS TO STAND OUT 🍀

- Be memorized! Nerves are real. The better you know your piece, the more confident you'll feel.
- Act your song! Step into character—how do they walk? Talk? What do they want from the audience?
 Are they playful, spooky, persuasive? Show us!
- Make a CHOICE. A big, bold, fearless one! Don't try to guess what we want—show us who YOU are
 as a performer.
- Bring appropriate dance shoes if you have them. Got tap, acro, gymnastics, or any cool tricks? Let us know on your audition form—we love to see unique talents

Remember: Leads aren't just the most talented people. The best voice doesn't equal the best role! At auditions we look for how you interact with others, follow instructions, show independence and resilience as well as talent and availability/commitment. Don't be discouraged if you don't think you're *perfect* for a role – it is possible for us to help a committed and diligent person grow throughout the rehearsal process – practice makes perfect!

BEETLEJUICE, JR. - SYNOPSIS

It's our show now, kid! The ghost-with-the-most comes to the stage in *Beetlejuice, JR.*, the frightfully funny musical based on the beloved motion picture turned Broadway phenomenon. Lydia Deetz is a strange and unusual teenager, still grieving the loss of her mother and obsessed with the whole "being dead thing." Lucky for Lydia, she and her father move to a new house haunted by a recently deceased couple and Beetlejuice, a delightful demon with a real zest for life. When Lydia calls on Beetlejuice to scare away anyone with a pulse, this double-crossing specter shows his true stripes, unleashing a (Nether)world of pandemonium.

With music and lyrics by Tony Award-nominee Eddie Perfect and a book by Tony Award-nominated pair Anthony King and Scott Brown, *Beetlejuice* was nominated for eight 2019 Tony Awards including Best New Musical. A viral "sucks-yes" on social media, this musical struck a chord with young theatre lovers who adored its unabashed humor and emotional honesty.

Created for the generation that made it a hit, Beetlejuice, JR. is a wacky theatrical party for all!

CHARACTER BREAKDOWN

One final tip as you begin your preparation. Do some research on the show and on the roles! This will help you get a better sense of what *Beetlejuice Jr.* is all about and who the various characters are.

Most roles? Open to any gender. Some roles? Specific to male and female genders. Our goal? To build a cast that reflects the wild, wacky, and diverse world we live in. So don't stress about whether you "fit" a role! If you bring the talent, the energy, and a little ghostly charm, you're in the running.

Unless you specifically tell us you're only interested in one part (which, hey, your call), we'll consider you for any and all roles, no matter who you read for at auditions. So, bring your best, bring your weirdness, and let's make some casting magic!

CAST

Lydia Deetz (Female) Whip-smart, grieving fifteen- year-old whose dark sense of humor helps her cope with the loss of her mother, Emily. Lydia is unfazed by Beetlejuice's antics and easily holds her own against both him and all things Netherworld.

Charles Deetz (Male) Lydia's father. He wants to help her get over the loss of her mother, although the ways he tries to "help" aren't really what Lydia needs. Charles is under a lot of pressure between his concerns over Lydia, his secret relationship with Delia, his professional life, and his own grief (which he tries to ignore).

Beetlejuice The dead guy of the hour! This titular character is zany, spooky, and absolutely hilarious. Though Beetlejuice exists in a morally gray area, he's more of a trickster than a malevolent threat. He's happy to align his interests with others, but ultimately, he's looking out for himself.

Adam Maitland (Male) Devoted husband of Barbara, just can't catch a break. While life's stresses were getting to him – renovation of the house, financial difficulties, and the decision about having a child – he certainly wasn't ready for death.

Barbara Maitland (Female) Barbara's stresses align with her husband's, in life and death, although Barbara is a bit more adventurous than Adam. She is very kind but also strong-willed and a quick thinker. Barbara immediately bonds with Lydia.

Delia Schlimmer (Female) Hopelessly (sometimes maniacally) optimistic. She believes fully in her guru, Otho, and considers herself a life coach, though underneath her façade she's quite fragile and desperately wants to fit in with the Deetzes. Delia loves Charles and genuinely cares about Lydia's well-being, even if her attempts to connect are somewhat misguided.

Maxie Dean (Male): The business tycoon whom Charles hopes to impress.

Sky (Female): An eager girl scout with a very unfortunate heart condition.

Miss Argentina (Female) Former beauty queen, greets the recently dead in the Netherworld. She leads "What I Know Now".

Maxine Dean (Female) Maxie's fourth (or fifth) wife.

Otho Delia's guru and occasional exorcist.

Juno (Female) Beetlejuice's mother, runs the recently dead intake with an iron fist. She has "a voice like road tar" and no sympathy for anyone.

Ensemble: Includes the Priest, The Recently Deceased (Parachute Jumper, Death by Toaster, Dead Cheerleader, Death by Fireworks, Cigar Mobster, Dead Jockey, Machete Groom, Dead Drill Team, and Hunter with a Shrunken Head or we will let our Recently Deceased Ensemble choose their death!), Mourners, Movers (Mover #1, Mover #2), Lawyers, Girl Scouts, Caiter-Waiter, Beetlejuice Clones, Cheerleaders, Studio Audience, Sandworm

AUDITION SONGS

Yes, you'll be singing solo—your moment to shine!

We've uploaded your audition song cuts to Dropbox (link below). Each song has two versions:

- Vocal Version to help you learn the melody and lyrics.
- Instrumental Version this is what you'll be singing with at auditions.

f Important: Make sure you rehearse with the instrumental version so you're ready to perform confidently without guide vocals.

Pay close attention to:

- Tempo how fast or slow the music goes.
- Entrances when you're supposed to come in and start singing.

And here's a golden tip:

Don't try to copy the singer on the vocal track!

We want to hear your version—the way *you* think the character would express themselves. Add your personality. Bring the character to life in your voice.

BEETLEJUICE:

SONG: "THE WHOLE BEING DEAD THING" - Sing this if you are auditioning for Beetlejuice

Start at beginning of song to 1:12

Hey, folks! Begging your pardon
'Scuse me, sorry to barge in
Now let's skip the tears and start on the whole
Y'know, "being dead" thing

You're doomed, enjoy the singing
The sword of Damocles is swinging
And if I hear your cell-phone ringing

I'll kill you myself The whole "being dead" thing

Now we're never gonna see 'em"
I can show you what comes next
So don't be freaked

Start at :10 to 1:15

And you'll be like, "What?"
And the universe will be like, "I know!"
